JOHNNA WRIGHT (*Author*) Johnna Wright is an accomplished Canadian director, dramaturg, and editor, who co-founded two significant theatre companies in Vancouver. With a BA in Theatre from UBC and an MFA in Directing from the University of Alberta, she co-founded the Bard on the Beach Shakespeare Festival in 1990 and the Solo Collective Theatre. Wright is a two-time winner of the Jessie Richardson Award for direction and production. She has directed numerous plays and worked as a dramaturg on dozens of new Canadian works. His first novel, *Craven House*, was published in 1926, and he quickly gained a wide readership. Despite a difficult life and struggles with alcohol, he produced some of his most acclaimed works. His plays include the thrillers *Rope* (1929) and *Gaslight* (1939), both of which were adapted into iconic films. His notable novels, known for their atmospheric and often bleak portrayal of London life, include *Hangover Square* (1941) and *The Slaves of Solitude* (1947).

ANDREW KINDIG (*Director*) Andy is honored to return to the Studio Series here at the Fulton Theatre.
